(2, \$25K grants) We are hoping for good things! We could use some people talking to the board of education (we are not receiving any money from county/state, parks department, etc.)

Hoping to do a Fifth Grade gift (bench); We are going to ask for donations (selling plaques) and send out another letter for corporate donations.

Lisa Rice confirmed tax deductible item that can be written off.

Report Cards going out on the 7th Panda Pride Assembly on the 14th

In the event your child tests positive for the flu, we are tracking the information. It is not at a concerning level for our school. Please let us know so Central Office can be notified by our nurse.

Mrs. Covelly will be sending a letter for testing Gr. 3, 4 and 5; Cognitivie Abilities Test for 2nd Grade Students all done online.

We look at what levels of service we may need to put in for students; lets the school look for support needs for special education or gifted and talented.

Please ensure you are sending in notes for absences within 3 days. If they are absent 10% of the time they are enrolled, they are 'chronically absent'. We are charged with having an attendance team. If you missed 20 days, you can be considered for retention, reviewed by the teams for

If you are following the board conversations and advocacy, lots of folks are advocating to Dr. Bulson; latest numbers \$22.4; We had a visit from Councilman Wagner, who visited John Archer and PMES. He said "I'm so enlightened, I'm actually overwhelmed". He expressed he know about the CSP program, about middle schools, about schools paying close to \$30K (and upward) per student;

Mrs. Jankowiak stated she relayed to Councilman Wagner that 25 in a kindergarten classroom is 'criminal' -it has to come down! It has nothing to due with economics, it has so much to do with engagement. Add any emotional or developmental delay and that is a tremendous task for a teacher in a room of 25. No one tells parents if your child is trashing a room, that is not typical and may need different interventions. Looking for people to provide good interventions, special educators at grade levels, the right resources for student needs. Mrs. Manolis is dedicated and working before school. The kids (and teachers) deserve to have help.

<u>GUEST SPEAKER: Sara Baker: Be SMART</u> Be Smart Program started by parents; Firearms are the second cause of death for children; Accidental death; firearm suicide; most injuries occur in home; 78% of shooters in schools obtain guns from home, relatives or friends. We want kids to group up happy/healthy; we have the right to make decisions about whether to have a gun in the home; If we can prevent one death or injury it is our responsibility to do so.

Secure all guns in home/vehicles

Model responsible behavior around guns

Ask about presence of unsecured guns in other homes

Recognize the risks of teen suicide

Tell your peers to be SMART

Use a cable lock, firearm safe or cable; ammunition always stored separately. There are now safes that require fingerprint;

Suggestion from Ashley: safe must be secured; if you drop the safe, the spring latch will pop open.

Nearly a quarter of parents are unaware their kids know where the guns are hidden/handle the gun; Gun safety training does not equate to less curiosity. Teach children to not touch guns (real or pretend) and to alert an adult. Approximately 4.6 million children live in a household with a loaded / unlocked gun. 17% of high school students have considered suicide in the past year; 41% have 'easy access' to a gun at home. Gun owners (military, law enforcement or hunting/outdoor groups) are modeling responsible gun safety.
