- Q; What do you plan to change this first year?

- Q; How is it determined about Professional Days?A: It is done above the school level; 11 snow days included (8 of which are in June)
- Q; Why is the conference day so early?A: Decision was made and planned above the school level
- Q; What is the school doing for community outreach?
 A: Faculty "jeans" Fridays for Charity; raised more than \$300 for Ashton; done on a pay day Friday; other ideas include Habitat for Humanity, Susan G Komen, someone with a need

A: Danielle will discuss with Timmi from the PTA side; kid involvement (Crayola recycling markers, Bags of Hope, gardens, etc.)

A: Idea presented for senior center visits

A: school also does mitten tree, candy grams, harvest for the hungry

- Q; Can spirit day earn money for charity? A \$1 to be silly.
- A: Used to be done before Mr. Cook. Will look into it.
- Q; How are they going to incorporate more recess?
 A: Mr. Hagan has a plan, an initiative; piloting a wellness program
